Football Prospects

A year of new beginings.

It is expected to be a year of change for the A Grade.

Ricky Depledge is now the A Grade coach, and walked into a rebuild. For reasons beyond his control his job has been made much harder than expected. For a variety of reasons, I won't go into each individual, much of last years A Grade side has moved on.

There are a heap of incoming players. Firstly, we have a group of last years u17s side moving up to senior football. We have recruited a group of players from the city and other clubs. Primarily amongst them are a group from Hope Valley FC, and a pair coming from Kadina FC.

Ricky has got perhaps the most talented young group going around. But they are young and will take time to become A Grade footballers. The year is expected to be difficult, but development is the key goal. So far trainings have focussed on heavily on skill and fitness.

Those involved with WFC footy operations are also looking ahead long term, and the team for next year is being planned well ahead of time. Many of the local players are likely to return, and yhe coaches intend to keep in contact with them. Plus Ricky has a bunch of imported players he missed out on this year that are on the cards to be recruited for next year.
